The NCC and the National Holocaust Monument

Building on more than a century of experience, the National Capital Commission is a federal Crown corporation with a mandate to build a capital of national importance and a source of pride for all Canadians. The NCC provides unique value in the Capital Region by fulfilling three specific roles: long-term planner of federal lands, principal steward of nationally significant public places, and creative partner committed to excellence in development and conservation.

Working in collaboration with Canadian Heritage, the NCC facilitates the development of new monuments and maintains existing ones that are located on NCC lands.

In September 2017, the Government of Canada inaugurated the National Holocaust Monument, titled "Landscape of Loss, Memory, and Survival." This monument stands as a poignant tribute to one of the darkest chapters in human history – the mass extermination of six million Jews during the Second World War – and honours the remarkable contributions of Holocaust survivors in Canada.

As the steward of the Capital, the NCC is proud to have been an important partner in the creation of the National Holocaust Monument by providing the land, as well as the land-use and design approvals, and overseeing the design and construction. The NCC is also responsible for the monument's long-term maintenance and preservation.
