President's Message - Wendy Eisner



As most of you already know, recently, the influential rapper, songwriter, and producer, Kanye West posted a series of antisemitic tweets on Twitter. West's tweets reached his 31.4 million Twitter followers – more people than there are Jews in the world. One of those tweets stated that he is “going death con 3 [sic] On JEWISH PEOPLE,” and “You guys have toyed with me and tried to black ball anyone whoever opposes your agenda.” Although he did not specify exactly what group he was addressing, it is clear that he was referencing the Jewish community.

Some are excusing West's behavior because he is mentally ill. Although mental illness is a disease and should be taken seriously, it should never be used to minimize the danger of hate speech or encourage the mass spread of antisemitic tropes.

That said, West's statements are upsetting for many reasons, and I am still having trouble fully expressing my feelings surrounding these remarks in an appropriate way. What I do know is that, as a Jew, I found his words offensive and terrifying.

I realized that I was the most terrified because West's influence reaches hundreds of millions of people around the world, including impressionable young people. While the Jewish people are being threatened by one of the most famous men in the world, millions of people still idolize him. After all, he is a celebrity.

This brings me to my next thought: as a society, why do we continue to celebrate such blatantly hateful people? Maybe it is our culture. Maybe it is our obsession with the ultra-wealthy. Or maybe because celebrities are considered leaders in American society. In my opinion, a person who makes such discriminatory statements – especially those that degrade an entire group of people – should not be celebrated or considered a leader.

Some of us have to learn how to be a leader and hone those skills over many years. Some are natural-born leaders, and no matter what they do or think, people will follow. Much to my dismay, West is one of those people. Regardless, leadership comes with responsibility – a responsibility to know right from wrong and to think about the strong impact that our words may have on those that rely upon our leadership. Strong leadership does not mean fueling hate speech, but standing up and speaking out against it.

It is here in our community that I feel empowered to speak out and share my anger about the rise in antisemitism and West's horrific remarks. It is also where I share my confidence in our Jewish community's resolve and ability to move forward together. Our community is warm, welcoming, and inclusive to all faiths and ideals. We are strong, especially when we join together. This gives me hope that we can collectively speak out against people like Kanye West and continue to thrive in a world where antisemitism is on the rise. If we do this, I am hopeful for a brighter future.

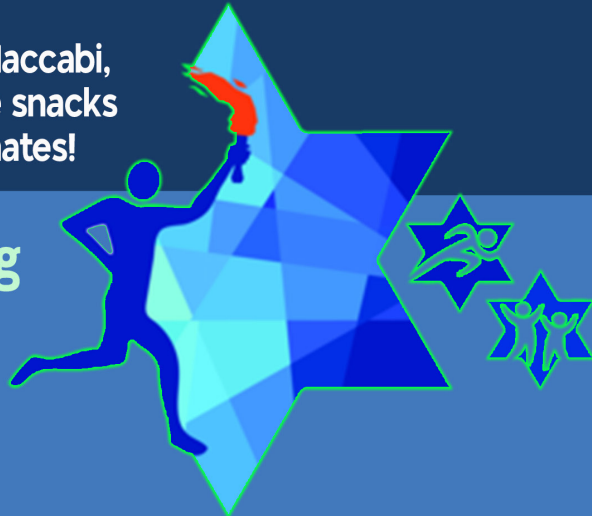

A Sarfan Center Horticultural Adventure: The Hidden Magic Behind Plants



The Sarfan Early Childhood Center is proud to reveal our latest project: hydroponics farming. This unique hands-on, indoor science lab creates opportunity for us to explore seedling growth year round, no matter what the weather! How does it work? Each hydroponics station consists of three growing tubes with numerous pods for seed baskets. We have two stations in our preschool foyer and one station in each of our three-year-old classrooms.

Together we monitor the amount of light and water needed for our specimens. The magic behind the science of hydroponics farming is that it doesn't require the need for soil; instead we are using a soilless culture packed with minerals and plant nutrients. Currently we are growing red and green mustard, dill, thyme, kale, butterhead lettuce, basil and more! We encourage our families and community members to take a walk

past our preschool foyer to view our produce as it grows! You never know, we may even have extra to share.



22nd Annual Virginia Peninsula Jewish Film Festival Sponsored by Temple Beth El of Williamsburg, Virginia

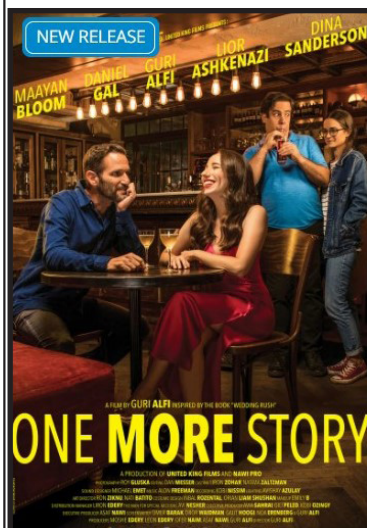

Sunday's matinee, *Berenshtein*, is a true-life thriller narrated by the last surviving great partisan leader from World War II. Berenshtein led his partly Jewish band of guerrillas in fierce struggles in the Ukraine and elsewhere to sabotage German train transports and, critically, pinpoint for Allied bombers the site of Hitler's V-2 doomsday missiles. Some events are reenacted, and the narrator is filmed revisiting today places where he fought. But the struggle was also personal: showing how despite tragedy and atrocities he was able to retain his values as a human being.

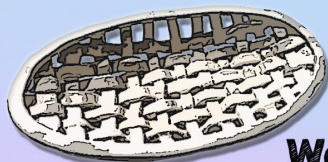

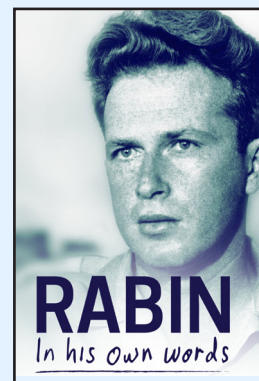

Jewish Inspired Thanksgiving Recipe

Thanksgiving isn't technically a Jewish holiday. And by technically, I mean actually. But that doesn't mean you can't have Jewish Thanksgiving Recipes! I love Thanksgiving. The food, of course, is some of the best around. Turkey. Mashed potatoes. Cranberry Sauce. All topped with bourbon gravy! Remember Thanksgiving? When Hanukkah and Thanksgiving overlapped for the first time in forever and the last time in 70,000 years or so? Yeah. It was the best food day ever. So now I aim to recreate the Jewish/Thanksgiving mashup every year.



PUMPKIN Pie BLINTZES

Servings: 8

PREP TIME COOK TIME
20 mins 15 mins

INGREDIENTS

For Batter

- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 1 tbsp sugar
- 1 tsp ground cinnamon
- 1/8 tsp salt
- 3 eggs whisked
- 1 cup milk
- 1 tbsp butter, melted and cooled
- unsalted butter for cooking
- whipping cream (for garnish)
- powdered sugar (for garnish)
- cinnamon (for garnish)

For Pumpkin Pie Filling

- 4 oz cream cheese, softened
- 1/2 cup powdered sugar
- 2/3 cup pureed pumpkin
- 2 tsp cinnamon
- 1/2 tsp nutmeg

INSTRUCTIONS

1. First, make your blintz batter. Whisk together the flour, sugar, cinnamon and salt. Then add the eggs, milk and butter and whisk until no lumps remain. Let your batter rest in the refrigerator at least 1 hour to let the gluten relax.

2. While your batter is resting, make the filling by whisking together cream cheese with sugar until smooth. Stir in pumpkin, cinnamon and nutmeg.

3. Now time to assemble! To prep, lay 4 large pieces of parchment paper close to the oven. To make blintzes, butter a 9-inch nonstick pan with a thin coat of butter over medium high heat. Then pour 1/4 cup of batter into the pan to coat the bottom. Swirl the pan to coat evenly. After about a minute you will see the ends begin to curl up- your blintz is done! Do not flip. Slide blintzes onto parchment paper to allow them to cool. Don't layer blintzes together or they will stick!

4. Spread a spoonful of the pumpkin mixture towards the bottom of each blintz. Fold the bottom of the blintz up to cover the filling and then fold the sides in. Then roll like a little Jewish burrito!

5. Add 1-tablespoon butter back to the medium non-stick pan over medium high heat and cook on each side until golden brown- or about 1-2 minutes per side. Garnish with whipped cream, powdered sugar and cinnamon!

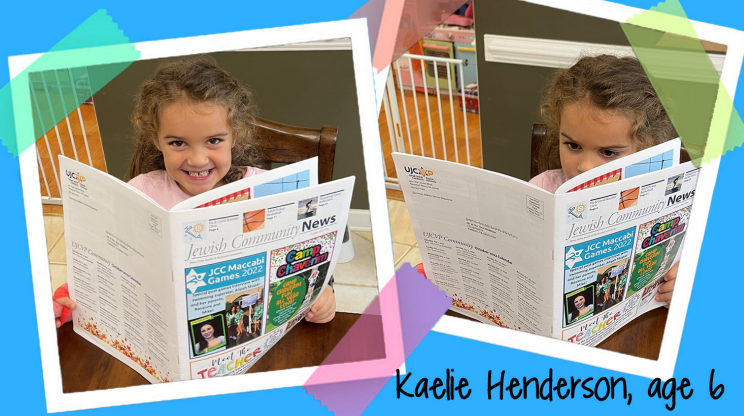

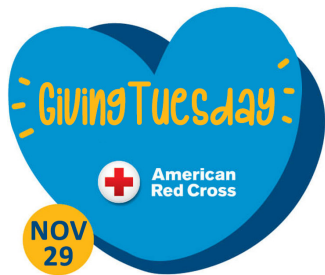

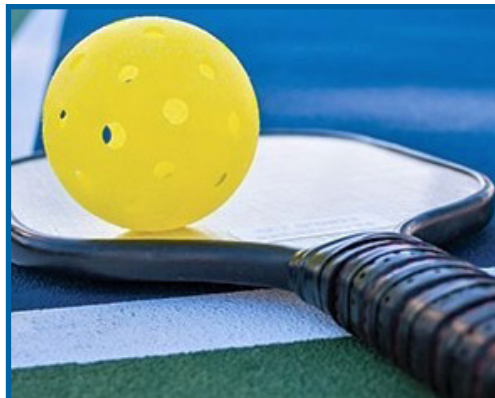

Jamie Geller's Pumpkin Spice Challah for Thanksgiving

Ingredients

3/4 c. warm water	1 tbsp. olive oil
1 pkg. (2 1/4 tsp.) active dry yeast	1 c. pumpkin puree
1 tsp. cinnamon	3 egg yolks
1/4 tsp. ground ginger	1/3 c. brown sugar
1/8 tsp. allspice	5 c. all purpose flour
1 tsp. salt	1 egg for brushing
1/4 tsp. nutmeg	pumpkin seeds

Instructions

1. In a large bowl, add warm water followed by yeast. Mix. Add rest of ingredients, except flour. Mix well.
2. Add the flour a little bit at a time, mixing to remove clumps. You might need more flour if dough is too sticky.
3. Knead for 5 minutes, until dough is smooth.
4. Place dough in oiled bowl. Flip over so oiled side is on top.

Cover. Leave bowl in warm place for one hour until doubled in size.

5. Divide dough in 3 parts. Shape into ropes. Braid, starting in center.

6. Place challah on baking sheet. Brush with egg wash and sprinkle with pumpkin seeds. Cover and allow to rise for 40 min. Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

7. Bake for 35-40 min. If top gets too brown, place a piece of foil on top
