EXPANDING MY WORLDVIEW & STRENGTHENING THE CONNECTION TO MY JUDAISM

Allie Teshome, Blinkoff Scholarship Winner

This summer, thanks to the generosity of the Jewish Federation of Orange County, NY I was able to go on the Yallah! Israel trip with my friends from URJ Crane Lake camp. This experience was 5 weeks long. We spent a week in Poland followed by 4 weeks in Israel. It was an incredible, once in a lifetime, trip filled with education, adventure, and lots of fun!

The weeklong journey started in Warsaw, Poland. We went to the Museum of the History of Polish Jews. We saw powerful sculptures and statues depicting what Polish Jews went through during World War II. We visited the sight of the Warsaw Ghetto and saw the remaining wall. Within the ghetto, we saw where the Warsaw ghetto uprising took place. We learned that the people who lead the uprising were teenagers: some were even younger than us. It was a powerful experience because these teenagers never stood a chance against the German Army but were willing to fight for and ultimately die for what they believed in.

Then we traveled to Krakow, Poland which was a 3-hour bus ride from Warsaw. This is where we spent an entire day in Auschwitz. The night before we had an evening program to prepare us for what we were going to experience on this day. We walked through the entire grounds of Auschwitz-Birkenau. We went through the entrance where the trains came through and we went up into the watch tower. From here we could see a view of most of the camp. This angle showed how enormous this camp was. I was shocked to find out that the population was that of a small city. At the conclusion of this day, we circled up and sang the mourners kaddish and Hatikvah to honor the victims. At the end of this difficult day, I felt hope because the Nazi's did not accomplish their goal of eliminating all Jewish people. We were there singing our prayers in Hebrew and continuing the traditions of our people.

At the end of this powerful week in Poland we were excited to begin our Journey in Israel. We started our time in Israel staying in the Negev desert for 4 days. We went on many hikes throughout our time in the desert. The most notable was our hike up Masada in which we reached the top just in time to see the sun rise. We rode camels which was a little scary but fun. We also went to the Dead Sea and put on the healing mud. It was joyful to experience all of that in our first few days in Israel. The next part of our journey led us to the holy city of Jerusalem. I loved celebrating Shabbat in Israel. We were able to sing all our songs and prayers just like we used to do at camp. It felt comforting because the service was so familiar, but also surreal to think we were actually celebrating Shabbat in Israel.

During my time in Israel, I chose to go on a 4-day experience called Tikkun Olam where I volunteered all around Israel. I went to a nursing home where we talked to the residents and played board games with them. I volunteered at a day camp with children that had special needs and at a home that housed adults with special needs. My friends and I then went to a food pantry where we packed over a thousand hot meals for those in need. We also packed bags of nonperishable food for families to take home with them. This experience made feel grateful and has motivated me to continue giving back to my community at home.

Our journey came to a close at the Western Wall where we celebrated our last Shabbat in Israel. We put our prayers to God on pieces of paper that went into the wall. This made me feel close to God and an even stronger connection to Judaism. As I reflect on this journey, I feel grateful and inspired. I understand how important it is to continue being a part of the Jewish community. I encourage other teens to go and experience the incredible land of Israel and I hope to go back again sometime soon.

 With family origins in Czech Republic, Slovakia, Romania, France, Russia, or Israel

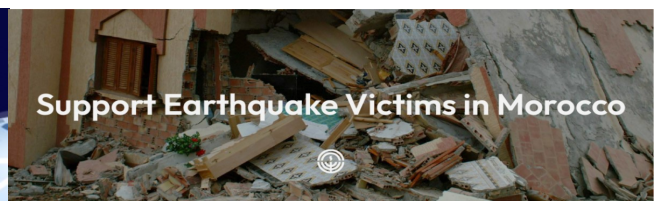
