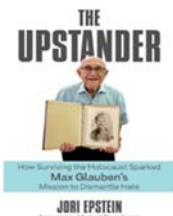
RABBI DAVID LEVIN

In March 1938, when Hitler's armies annexed Austria, forcibly stripping the country of its sovereignty and officially making it part of Germany, there were 185,000 Jews living in Vienna. Out of a population of two million people residing there, this community of Jews, many generations old, constituted ten percent. Vienna held the largest population of German speaking Jews in all of Europe at the time. Julie Metz's mother, Eva Singer, was one of them.

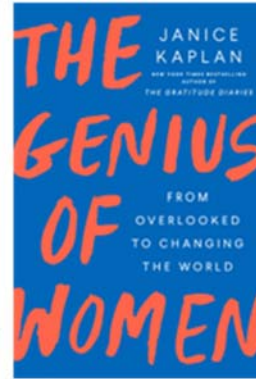
