While I'm not a very religious person, I do enjoy gleaning whatever wisdom I can from all sources. That is why this commentary on a Torah portion (MyJewishLearning.com/article/parashat-terumah-hidden-gifts) speaks to me. The commentary explains that the Ark that held the stone tablets that Moses brought down from Mount Sinai was to have two cherubs facing each other. They are supposed to represent "ish el achiv" – a man facing his brother. It is between those two faces, according to this commentary, that God's presence is promised to "become known".



The idea that "God's presence" will be between two humans who are face-to-face tells me that we should be in each other's presence to hear each other, see each other, learn about each other, and ultimately, to strengthen our community. Nowhere, to my knowledge, does it say in the Torah that we should, or will, all get along. But it does encourage us to be face-to-face. Many of us have retreated more into ourselves or small groups since COVID. And yet, our larger community is still here. So when you're ready to be face-to-face with more of the community, there are a few upcoming opportunities for that!

At our Annual Meeting on June 9th at Temple Sinai in Middletown, you'll be able to be face-to-face with your community and learn about all of the programs and events we supported in our 2023 fiscal year. You'll also learn about how many scholarships, microgrants, and other community supports we were able to provide as a result of the funds we were able to raise in our 2023 Annual Campaign. At our 2nd Annual Federation Funday on August 18th at Thomas Bull Memorial Park, you'll be able to be face-to-face with the community and do some shopping for gifts from our vendors or at our silent auction. Faces of October Seventh with Eden Gafner



On May, 8th Eden Gefner told us about her, her boyfriend and family's story of survival on October 7th, through a program called Faces of October Seventh. Allyson Levin introduced this program to The Jewish Federation. Below is her introduction speech for Eden Gefner.

Good evening! My name is Allyson Levin and I am currently a junior at Minisink Valley High School. I want to thank all of you for joining us to listen to our guest speaker, **Eden Gefner** tell her story. Eden is a survivor of the October 7th massacre in Israel. She is part of a group called **Faces of October 7th**. I first heard about this group in November of 2023 when another survivor shared his story at my brother, Josh's college. I immediately was interested in seeing if I could introduce a survivor to our community and I am so glad that I persisted because this really is a once-in-a-lifetime event.



When I first found out that Eden was in the attic of her parents' house hiding for 26 hours I could only feel extreme anguish that someone would have to go through that. However, I am glad that we have the opportunity to hear Eden's story tonight. The other thought that went through my mind was about my family's experience in the Holocaust. For those of you who don't know, I am the granddaughter of a Holocaust survivor and I could not be prouder. My grandmother, as well as my great aunt, great uncle, and great grandparents, survived the Holocaust, but sadly the rest of my family was killed. I am so thankful that my grandmother is sitting here with us tonight! When I was growing up, I would always hear bits and pieces about what my family went through, but there are always certain parts that stick out. In 1941, my great-grandpa David and my great-uncle Andre, who was 10 at the time, finally escaped from their third concentration camp and arrived at a hotel in France that sheltered Jews. Since this hotel was known to have Jews, it was constantly raided by the Nazis. My great-grandfather knew that the hotel was prone to raids, so he insisted on staying on the third floor which was the top floor when they were originally given a room on the first floor. Finally, my great-grandfather and my great-uncle were given a room on the third floor, but my great-grandfather had a plan in mind. He knew that the third floor of the hotel had an attic. He also knew that an attic would be their best bet in staying safe from the Nazis. When they arrived in the room, my great-grandfather explored the room as he let my uncle Andre feel freedom once again. Before it was night time my great-grandfather told my uncle Andre that they had to go into the attic for the night, but he didn't want to scare his young son. He carefully picked up my Uncle Andre and helped him up into the attic, and then my great-grandfather used his complete body weight to pull himself up into the attic and held my uncle in his arms. That night the hotel was raided and the only two Jews that were still there, were my great-grandfather and my uncle Andre. Sunday night marked Yom HaShoah, which is Holocaust Remembrance Day. A day where we as people, remember the past, so that history does not repeat itself.



The horrific attack by Hamas on October 7, 2023, resulted in the largest amount of Jewish people killed in one day since the Holocaust. Hamas, a terrorist group, possesses the same hate that the Nazis had. The reason that I am alive today is because of a non-Jewish nurse who helped smuggle my grandmother out of the infirmary she was born in, which was in a concentration camp. The righteous people are the non-Jews who helped fight antisemitism and hate. Today, I believe that there are still plenty of righteous people and together we can distinguish hatred with love for everyone.

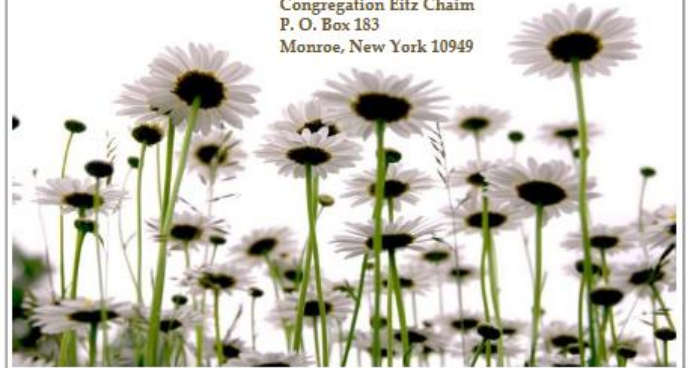

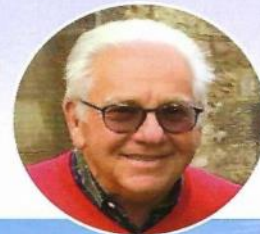
