ABOUT THE EXHIBIT

This collection comprises forty, self-contained, pull-up panels containing images and textual information concerning the persecution and extermination of European Jews by Nazi Germany during the period of 1933-1945. The posters are based on a Simon Wiesenthal Center traveling exhibition. Poster topics include four major themes: Nazi Germany, 1933-1938; Moving Toward the "Final Solution", 1939-1941; Annihilation in Nazi-Occupied Europe, 1941-1945; and Liberation - Building New Lives.

BORROW THIS EXHIBIT

There are 200 linear feet of display that can be configured in several ways. Approximately 1500-2000 square feet is required to host the display. A cargo van is preferred to transport the panels. Each panel with self-contained stand weighs about 22.5 pounds and has handles for carrying.

There is no charge for hosting this exhibit. The HEC will provide printed materials for clients to duplicate for their visitors. Groups generally have kept it on display for three to four weeks.
