Curmudgeon widower Nat Dayan clings to his way of life as a kosher bakery shop owner in London's East End. Understaffed, Nat reluctantly enlists the help of teenager Avyash, who has a secret side gig selling marijuana to help his immigrant mother make ends meet. When Avyash accidentally drops his stash into the mixing dough, the challah starts flying off the shelves and an unlikely friendship forms between the old Jewish baker and his young Muslim apprentice. *Dough* is a warmhearted and humorous story about overcoming prejudice and finding redemption in unexpected places.

MY HERO BROTHER

A group of remarkable young people with Down syndrome embark on a demanding trek through the India Himalayas, accompanied by their "normal" brothers and sisters. Unresolved conflicts and the complexities of growing up with a Down syndrome child in the family come to surface, while a heart-warming and special closeness develops among the siblings as they deal with formidable physical and emotional challenges. Through the eye of the camera, we catch a glimpse into the internal world of those with Down syndrome, and are led on our own journey of discovery and admiration as their inspiring natural qualities begin to emerge.

HARMONIA

97min – Drama – Hebrew/English Subtitles

A contemporary variation of the biblical story of Abraham, Sarah, Hagar and Isaac. Sarah, a harpist with the Jerusalem Philharmonic Orchestra is married to its conductor Abraham. When Hagar, a young Palestinian horn player, joins the orchestra, the thin balance in their family is shaken. *Harmonia* uncovers the metaphoric emotional roots of the ancient conflict between two people living in Jerusalem, now seeking harmony through a dramatic encounter between Western and Eastern music.
