For my mother, moving to live closer to us or into a senior home was never an option that she would consider. The upheaval from the many forced mandates to move during her youth and early adult years, caused her to especially cherish the freedom to live on her own terms. My first association with the Jewish Federation was through my mother. She always was excited to attend their monthly lunch bunches, or programs. When she no longer could drive, the Federation would drive her to doctors' appointments and social outings. Then came the time when my mom was physically unable to live in her own home, which was one of her deepest concerns. On behalf of the Federation, Ann Berman put my mom in touch with tradespeople who could redesign her bathroom and add a ramp to her home. They also discussed options for home care, all of which gave my mother what she really wanted – a chance to live with dignity in her own home.
