## JFGR 2019 Mission Trip to Israel by Cathy Winick

Recently a group of sixteen Grand Rapidians visited Israel, our first community mission trip since 2005.

We'll share some of the highlights here...

**When we arrived** at Ben Gurion Airport on Monday, January 14, we were met by our personal tour guide, Marty Friedlander, and bus driver, Albert.

We headed to the city of Tel Aviv, with its rich history and beauty. We strolled the streets of Jaffa enjoying a variety of lunch options. We ascended from the old port through the renovated alleyways to the Jaffa Overlook for an introduction to Tel Aviv at the place where it all began!

We enjoyed a kosher meat dinner at the Tel Aviv restaurant Goshen with our guest speaker, Dr. Raviv Schwartz, a social scientist with Hebrew University, who oriented us with a talk titled, *Israel and the Zionist Dream*.

**Day Two** began with an Israeli Breakfast at our hotel, Herod's, directly on the Mediterranean Sea. I would define Israeli Breakfast as the very best Sunday brunch buffet you have ever experienced. And we began each day this way. With shakshuka, hot sahlab, fresh persimmons, halva, just to name a few of the exotic choices.

After breakfast we headed to a Jewish hostel to meet with David Siegel, former Consul General of Israel to the Southwest United States, who wowed our group with his considerable knowledge with his topic, *Israel Now-What Are the Burning Issues?*

We then took in a quiet moment at the Prime Minister Yitzhak Rabin Memorial. We strolled along Dizengoff Boulevard to view examples of the Bauhaus architecture from the 1930s. We learned the local proliferation of the style that won Tel Aviv recognition as a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Our guide, Marty, then lead us on a LaDa'at Ethnic Tasting Tour, where we visited Levinsky Market vendors who shared samples of their finest street foods with us, a foodies' paradise. We walked along the newly-opened Independence Trail in Tel Aviv that begins with the founding of Tel Aviv in 1909 and ends with the establishment of Israel in 1948.

**On Day Three** we had an early start, heading north along the coast to Caesarea, one of the Land of Israel's most important landmarks, built during the Roman Period. We explored the Herodian theater and new excavations along the Mediterranean shore. A beautiful day, with gusty winds that brought the waves right up the base of the ruins.

We continued north to Central Galilee Partnership Region, to see some of the achievements and how the Federation has impacted the lives of local residents. We stopped at Kfar Tikvah, Village of Hope, an inspirational residential program for adults with disabilities. We visited the Tulip Winery, that is committed to providing employment and dignity to the Kfar Tikvah residents. And, oh, their wines are ambrosial!

We then headed to Yemin Orde - IsraElite Young Women's Leadership Program for Immigrant Youth. Village Way Educational Initiatives (VWEI) was established in 2006 to transform struggling frameworks for immigrant and at-risk youth into thriving educational communities. Several young soldiers, and soldiers-to-be spoke to us about the importance of this program in their lives.

Dinner followed at Kehillat Nigun HaLev where we met informally with members of the community.

**On Day Four**, we bade adieu to Tel Aviv, and headed south to Jerusalem. Our first stop was a tour of Susan's House, which changes the lives of some of Jerusalem's most troubled teens by empowering them to take charge of their future through business entrepreneurship. Here, alienated and at-risk 15- to 18-year-olds regain trust in themselves and others as they work under the guidance of Israeli artists to create beautiful crafts. Many of us purchased some lovely souvenirs, and performed a mitzvah at the same time.

Then we met with Rina Goldberg, the managing director of external relations and special projects in the Jewish Federations of North America (JFNA) Jerusalem, regarding the work of JFNA in Israel.

Later, we headed to the Jewish Agency for Israel's (JAFI) Global Service Center and learned about the Aliya Hotline. Then we went to Yad Vashem, the Jewish National Memorial of the six million Jewish victims of the Holocaust. The museum visit was one of the most emotional times for our group in all of Israel.

After dinner, we took a late-night walking tour of the Western Wall Tunnel, the underground continuation of the Temple Mount's Western Wall.

**On Day Five**, that morning we met with Tehila Nachalon, Board Member of the Yerushalmit Movement that is working to build a vibrant, inclusive, civil society in Jerusalem.

We then rode Jerusalem's light rail system, starting at the Pisgat Ze'ev neighborhood, continuing through the Arab villages of Shuafat and Beit Hanina and ultra-Orthodox area of Ramot Eshkol, and ending at the Old City. We saw first-hand the mosaic and diversity of the Jerusalem population. Our guide discussed the differences between East and West Jerusalem and the ongoing struggles between the city's different communities.

Later, Rabbi Krishef led us in a Pre-Kabbalat Shabbat service at the egalitarian section of the Western Wall. A festive Shabbat dinner back at our hotel, the Dan Panorama, led to leisurely conversations until nearly midnight.

**On Day Six,** We had the choice of passing Shabbat on our own or at various services within walking distance.

Our group reconvened for Havdallah service at Ben Kodesh Lechol, overlooking Jaffa Gate. Afterward, we headed around the corner to the Tower of David Museum where the walls of the Citadel serve as a stage for the new Night Spectacular show - a celebration of sight and sound depicting the story of Jerusalem.

The Kedma restaurant at the Mamila Mall welcomed our group as we dined and shared our wonderful reminiscences of the unforgettable events of the week. We hope you will join us next time!
