It's June. The end of the school year, the start of summer vacations, and when we wonder, 'how is half the year over already'?

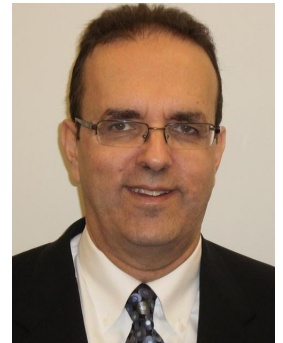
