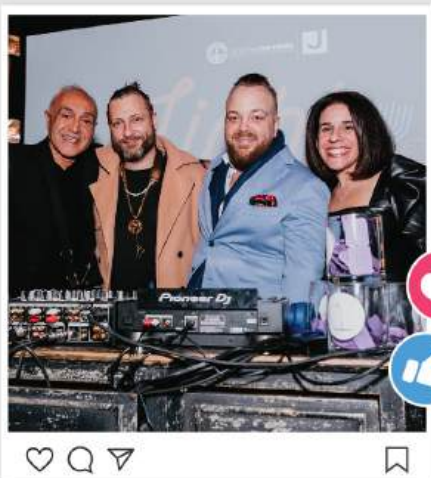
In 2023, we accomplished our ultimate goal. We had the privilege of taking a mission to Israel with 80+ community members to celebrate Israel's 75th birthday! Our community hadn't taken a mission in nearly two decades so we knew this would be a big undertaking. The mission, chaired by Karin Sporn, invited participants to choose a personalized itinerary based on their interests, whether it be in food, art, or security, to name a few. This journey was more than just an exploration of our shared heritage; it was a deepening of our connections to our ancestral homeland, a collective journey of discovery, connection, and renewal.

However, just a few short months after our return, on October 7th, Israel faced an unprecedented attack. We found ourselves angry, shocked, outraged, and sad. In the face of this tragedy, our community and organization stepped up to help Israel when it needed us most. We were able to act quickly on October 7th, and in the days that followed, because Federation was already there. Your generous support enables us to mobilize quickly, providing crucial assistance during a time of great need.

While responding to this international crisis, we also continued to care for our community and fight the rising tide of antisemitism around the world and even throughout our state. We have seen an alarming increase in antisemitic incidents, and we have been on the front lines, advocating for our community and ensuring that our voices are heard. Our commitment to safeguarding and uplifting Jewish life in Nevada has never been stronger.

Amidst the incredible challenges that 2023 brought, we have also celebrated significant milestones. The successful closing of our annual campaign is a testament to the faith you place in our mission. Annual Campaign An investment in the Jewish Nevada Annual Campaign is a commitment to our community and our ability to create vibrant and thriving Jewish life in Nevada, Israel, and around the world. Our priorities, like keeping our community safe; providing more programming through Hillel, the JCC, and in Northern Nevada; taking care of the most vulnerable; and strengthening our bond with Israel, have grown every year. Since 1966, The Jewish Nevada Annual Campaign has raised over \$93 million.

Designated Giving refers to funds donor directed for priority needs within the Nevada Jewish community that need additional funds beyond the reach of the Annual Campaign.

Special Gifts and Pass-through These funds are earmarked for unique and strategic initiatives that advance Jewish Nevada's mission, including emergencies such as the war in Ukraine or the crisis in Israel. Pass-Through giving refers to specific gifts donors send through Jewish Nevada to other eligible 501(c)3 nonprofit organizations. Jewish Nevada passes 100% of funds onto the nonprofit.

Estate and Endowment income is generated by donations made to Jewish Nevada through an established endowment fund or through a bequest.

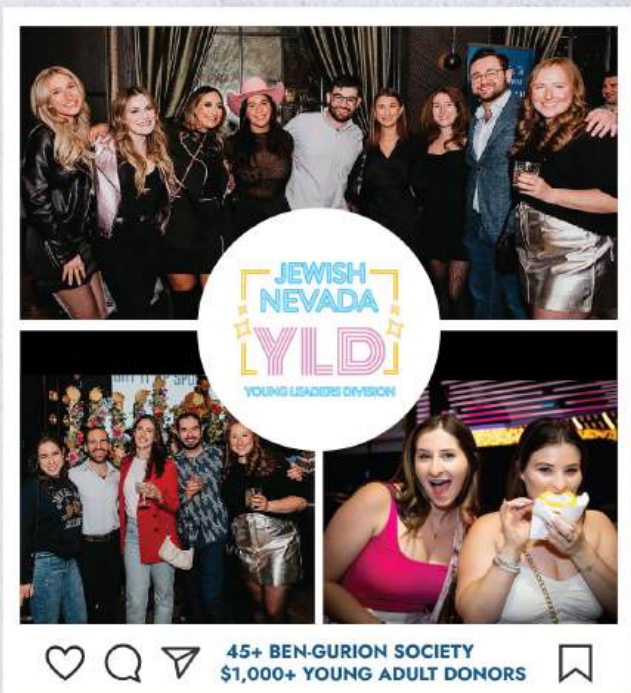

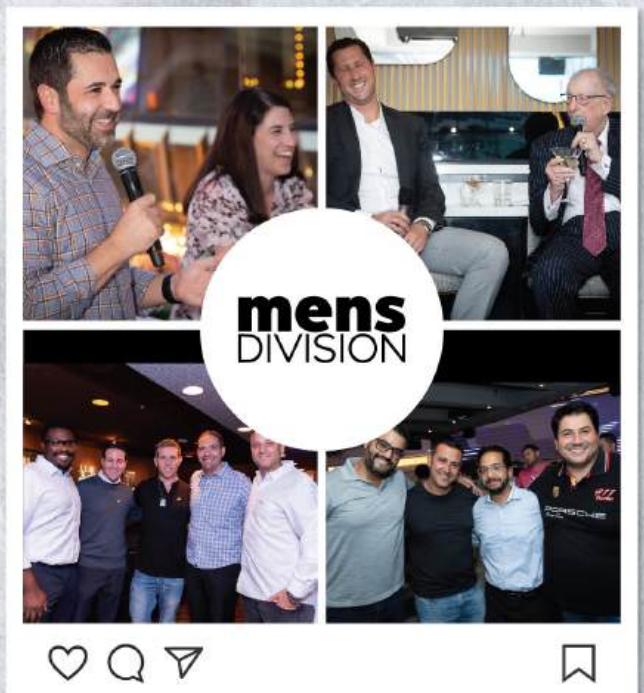
In 2023, Women's Philanthropy continued to proudly represent over 50% of our Annual Campaign dollars raised. We hosted a record-breaking United featuring Debra Messing, and inspired everyone in the room to stand up for Israel. One of our favorite Outreach events in 2023 was challah-making with the @challahprince. In partnership with all 4 major synagogues, we brought together over 100 women in one room to learn some advanced challah techniques and build community.

Jewish Nevada YLD is creating awesome Jewish experiences that focus on engaging and empowering young Jewish adults in their 20s and 30s. YLD is committed to creating a diverse and open space for young Jewish Leaders in Las Vegas. We improve our community, network, and connect, offering 1 to 2 high quality social, community service, or leadership development events every month. Young Leaders has been a staple in the Jewish Nevada programs, but with a refresh and new branding this year, it's quickly found a new niche for 20s and 30s who are looking to be Jewish together. **Jason Schifrin, Chair.**



In 2023, a record 150 men joined the Solomon Society, giving \$1,800 or more. The mens division hosted 4 unique events including a tour of the Boring Company tunnels, a fireside chat with Former Mayor of Las Vegas Oscar Goodman at Oscar's at the Plaza, and the Solomon Society exclusive event featuring Simon Plosker from Honest Reporting. 2023 was a banner year for the JCC with the return of the Las Vegas Jewish Book Festival, Viva Oy Vegas and the Adult Bowling League. JCC membership grew 22% while program participation grew substantially as well. In addition to J-Cares Passover, Thanksgiving and Chanukah, J-Cares hosted a back to school supply drive. Due to the generosity of our members and our community, we were able to provide a backpack filled with school supplies to 108 children at risk. But the most exciting news for the JCC is moving into a new, bigger, more modern space. With room for more programs and events than ever before. Jewish Summer Camp transforms lives. You want your child to explore their identity, make new friends, and have the summer of a lifetime. This Way to Camp J. For over 25 summers, Camp J has been providing families with an exciting, safe, and welcoming camp experience for families of all backgrounds. Camp J grew by 26% over 2022 and Camp J Overnight saw a 40% increase compared to 2022. Campers enjoy a combination of specialty camps like e-games and gymnastics and traditional camp activities like field trips, color wars, cooking, and sports. Plus, campers in 3rd – 8th grade have an opportunity to join us for one-week at the Camp J Overnight at Potosi Pines Camp.

With a century of rich history, BBYO has brought leadership training, community service opportunities, Jewish education, a connection to Israel and positive identity to thousands of Jewish teens. Today, BBYO reaches 70,000 Jewish teens across 50 countries around the world, making it the leading pluralistic Jewish youth movement worldwide. BBYO aspires to be a safe and welcoming community where teens develop their own personal Jewish identity. The teen-led programming is fun and meaningful, and teens emerge with precious friendships and practical leadership skills that will serve them well into the future. There are currently 60 teens in Las Vegas BBYO including 30 new members in 2023.



Something magical happens when parents sit down to read with their children. PJ Library sends free children’s books with Jewish content to families across the world every month. PJ Library is a program of the Harold Grinspoon Foundation that is brought to our community through a partnership with Jewish Nevada, the JCC of Southern Nevada, local synagogues, and schools, and private donors. PJ Library welcomes Jewish families with children six months to eight years old. After graduating from PJ Library, kids between eight and twelve years old can sign up for PJ Our Way to create their own online profile and choose their own Jewish-themed chapter books. In Nevada, 1,211 children are enrolled in PJ Library and 159 are enrolled in PJ Our Way.

Northern Nevada



Northern Nevada continues to see growth in our programming, outreach, and campaign goals. From a PJ Library Havdalah to a conversation and book signing with author Claire Stanford, a men's division event at Ferino Distillery, Jewish Heritage at the Ballpark and our signature community-wide event Milk & Honey, Northern Nevada came together to engage and enrich our community. After the tragic events of Oct. 7th, we hosted a Stand with Israel vigil filled with community members, allies, and dignitaries, with over 150 people in attendance. In addition, we created an Empty Table Shabbat for those who could not celebrate Shabbat with their families. Since 2021, Jewish Nevada has included over 3,000 Northern Nevadans in Jewish programming, with numbers climbing each year. All money raised in Northern Nevada for the Jewish Nevada Annual Campaign stays in Northern Nevada. In 2023, we raised an additional 11% in Northern Nevada over 2022.

Hillel of Northern Nevada



Hillel of Northern Nevada is the home of Jewish life at UNR and surrounding campuses in Northern Nevada. We help students "Do Jewish" their own way. Hillel also fights all kinds of antisemitism and works closely with the university to make sure Jewish students are protected and feel safe to be on campus. Programs in 2023 included Shabbat dinners, social events, holiday celebrations, antisemitism workshops, and a leadership Shabbaton.

Throughout the year, and more often since 10/7, Hillel has had the opportunity to meet with UNR President Brian Sandoval and other university administrators to discuss the climate on campus and any concerns our Jewish students have. These meetings have been very productive and the university truly does care for the safety of all students, including Jewish students. At least once every school year, sometimes each semester, Hillel hosts Secure Community Network's Nevada Regional Security Advisor, Beth Lamanna, for a talk on countering active threats and Run, Hide, Fight training.

Hillel Las Vegas



Hillel Las Vegas was a hub for Jewish students in 2023, particularly post-10/7 with the rise of antisemitism on campuses nationwide. Hillel consistently provides a place to safely share thoughts and feelings, get resources, and be with other like-minded students. The students have come together to show their support for Israel, learn more about being a better Israel advocate, and how to fight antisemitism. We also strengthened our relationship with UNLV faculty and assisted in the creation of the Jewish Faculty Affinity Group. Together, we are all working to build a stronger, safer, and more resilient Jewish community.

In 2023, we engaged 587 students and faculty members at UNLV at more than 50 events including Monday Lunches, holiday programs, social outings and more!

In 2023, the Jewish Nevada community security initiative to educate and inform our community became more important than ever among a dramatic rise in antisemitic incidents nationwide. Jewish Nevada has partnered with Security Community Network to bolster community safety and security. Retired FBI Special Agent Beth LaManna is leading the effort. This state-wide security program has been launched to better protect members of the Jewish community across Nevada who attend area synagogues, day schools, and other facilities.

Hebrew Free Loan

Hebrew Free Loan of Jewish Nevada allows community members to chase their dreams and overcome obstacles through interest and fee-free loans. In 2023, Hebrew Free Loan took off and doubled in size, providing a crucial "hand-up" to Jews across Nevada. Since 2019, Jewish Nevada has issued 49 loans totaling more than \$255,000. Additionally, we were honored to host the 2023 International Association of Jewish Free Loans Conference, with 65 representatives from sister loan agencies across North America.

On October 7th, Jewish communities around the world awoke with horror and disbelief as we learned that terrorists from Gaza had infiltrated Israel. More than 1,200 innocent Israelis lost their lives, 240 Israelis and people of other nationalities were abducted and taken hostage to Gaza, and nearly 2,000 people were wounded during the brutal terror attacks.

Jewish Nevada has raised over \$878,868 from more than 620 donors for the Israel Emergency Fund. Jewish Nevada has a task force specifically focused on allocating the funds raised that meets every two weeks. As of December 31, 2023, we've granted \$791,826 to these organizations. Priority Areas for Allocations

Jewish Nevada's 2023 Community Grant Round invested \$250,000 in Caring for the Vulnerable, Jewish Vibrancy & Continuity, and Israel & Global Impact.



JEWISH VIBRANCY & CONTINUITY

With valuable partners like Chabad of Red Rock, we sponsored adult education classes- providing a grant of \$2,500 towards hosting weekly Judaic classes geared towards community members who don't have any other Jewish presence in their lives.



CARING FOR THE VULNERABLE

In order to lift up those in our community in need, we provide grants to local agencies of up to \$20,000. In 2023, these dollars provided regular food deliveries to needy community members, diapers to over 300 families, social events for adults with Autism, and affordable housing for veterans. In addition, we work with our partners to make sure that all Jewish families in our community can celebrate all holidays.



ISRAEL AND GLOBAL IMPACT

Our partners in Ramat HaNegev are never alone with your support. In 2023, we visited our sister community in June on the Israel @ 75 Mission. Thanks to you, we partnered on several projects in the region, including programs supporting at-risk youth, recruiting qualified educators, and even sponsoring a defibrillator for the region through United Hatzalah.

2023 Allocations

In 2023, Jewish Nevada granted more than \$1.7 million to Jewish preschools, day schools, summer camps, synagogues, community organizations, and social service agencies. We increased our investment in Jewish education scholarships by 30%. In the face of challenges in our community and globally, your collective giving means we can be strong, prepared, and resilient. These are a few highlights of those allocations.



RIGHT START:

Jewish Nevada proudly offers the Right Start voucher, incentivizing families to choose a Jewish education for the first time. Through this program in 2023, 70 Jewish preschoolers began their Jewish journey with \$85,250 in tuition assistance.



OPPORTUNITY GRANTS:

Not all programs are big ones, and that's why we provide Opportunity Microgrants of up to \$1,000 for nonprofits serving the Jewish community in Nevada. These ideas are big and small: in 2023 we funded \$6,850 towards antisemitism workshops, Shabbat dinners, Passover programs, community menorah lightings, Jewish outings at Las Vegas Ballpark, and more.



HEBREW CEMETERY:

\$13,000 was allocated to the Hebrew Cemetery of Reno to support Jewish burial needs in Northern Nevada. In Southern Nevada, Jewish Nevada's endowed indigent burial program also supports those most vulnerable in our community to have a headstone.



JEWISH CAMP:

Kids who attend Jewish sleepaway and day camps are more likely to participate in the Jewish community during the school year. Jewish Nevada makes these experiences accessible through a variety of programs. We sponsor local Jewish day camps across the state, provide needs-based funding for sleepaway camps, and offer a One Happy Camper grant as an incentive for first-year campers. In 2023, we invested \$20,648 to support 135 need-based campers at 7 local day camps and an additional \$51,340 in scholarships for 61 need-based and first-time overnight campers.



SCHOLARSHIPS:

Jewish Nevada provided more than \$300,000 in needs-based scholarships to 186 students at 6 Jewish Day Schools and 64 children in 9 Jewish early childhood education centers throughout Nevada.



HOLOCAUST SURVIVOR GROUP OF SOUTHERN NEVADA:

65 Holocaust Survivors received regular events and unique social experiences, supported by a Jewish Nevada annual grant.



JEWISH NEVADA SUPPORTS CELEBRATE ISRAEL FESTIVAL WITH A \$10,000 GRANT, APRIL 30TH



ISRAEL EXPERIENTIAL EDUCATION:

Our ties with Israel are stronger than ever, and 27 teens and young adults received \$32,856 to learn, explore, and experience Israel through Israel Programs Scholarships.



AISHEL AVRAHAM:

A local kosher food bank, ensuring all Jews in Las Vegas have a hot meal for Shabbat and the Jewish Holidays was able to serve 100 families weekly, thanks to a grant of \$15,000 from Jewish Nevada.



JFSA:

Through our partners at Jewish Family Service Agency, Jewish Nevada provided more than \$300,000 to support social service programs for 75,000 community members, with emergency assistance designated for Jews in need.

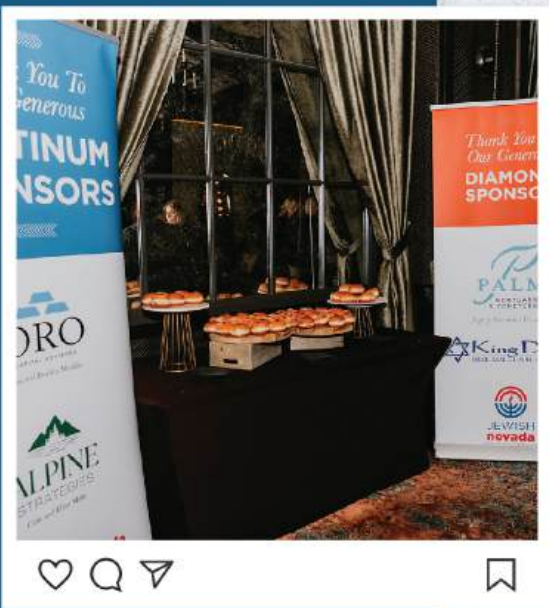
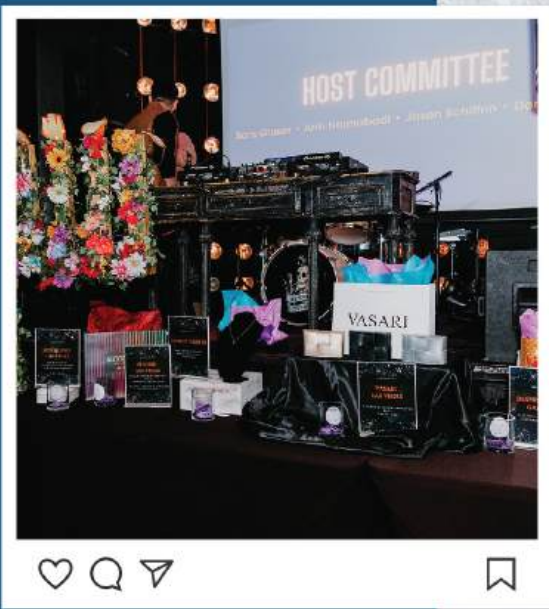
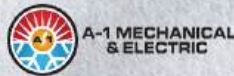
