

CODE OF CONDUCT

Jewish Long Beach (Alpert JCC) offers a friendly and comfortable environment for all. As a family facility, we expect all members, guests, and visitors to act within the boundaries of Jewish Long Beach's core values of honesty, respect, responsibility, and caring, including, but not limited to, the following:

Members, guests, and visitors may not make threats, fight, or engage in any inappropriate or unwanted physical contact with another person.

Members, guests, and visitors suspected to be under the influence of alcohol or drugs will not be allowed admission into the facility and will be asked to leave the premises if they are found to be under the influence of alcohol or drugs.

Smoking, vaping, the use of e-cigarettes, or chewing tobacco is not permitted on JLB property.

Members, guests, and visitors are expected to act and dress in a manner which is in line with our values. Any display of messages or images which are deemed to be in conflict with those values are not permitted. JLB reserves the right to determine at its sole discretion what constitutes a violation of this policy.

Members, guests, and visitors are expected to comply with all posted signs and staff instructions.

Members, guests, and visitors may not take any photographs/videos in the locker rooms and restrooms. See also the Photography & Videography Policy.

Members, guests, and visitors are expected to be respectful of all JLB property and will be held responsible for damage.

Children under the age of 13 cannot be left unattended at any time. One adult chaperone is required for every group of 15 children under the age of 13.

Members, guests, and visitors are restricted from all staff areas (i.e.: courtesy desk, storage areas) and are prohibited from moving equipment (i.e.: pickleball nets). Please ask JLB staff for assistance.

No one is allowed to conduct business on the premises unless previously agreed to with management and documented in writing.

All exits and pathways shall remain clear at all times and conform with all municipal, state, and federal safety regulations.

Aiding in the unauthorized entrance of any person, sharing membership cards for access to the facility or unauthorized access to programs, services or classes is prohibited.

Any behavior that endangers the life, safety or health of others is prohibited.

Loitering, or causing annoyance or alarm, to other members or staff is prohibited.

Solicitation, gambling, proselytizing or panhandling of any kind is prohibited.

Violation of any law not listed herein is prohibited.

Violations of any of these rules may result in termination of membership. JLB reserves the right to remove from the premises any individual acting in an inappropriate manner. Please note: these premises are under 24-hour recorded video surveillance.

POOL RULES

NO Breath holding, running, diving, squirt guns, gum, horseplay, glass, alcohol, smoking, monofins, or hanging on lane lines

Children under 12 years of age will not be allowed at the pool without adult supervision.

A 25-yard, lifeguard-administered swim test is mandatory for all children younger than 12 who would like to swim in the deep end of the main pool independently. No exceptions. Once passed, each child will be given a wristband to be kept visible at all times to be allowed in the deep end. **This swim test must be done every day the child is in the pool. If a wristband is lost or removed on the day it was given, the swim test must be retaken.**

Proper swim attire is required; no cut off shorts or basketball shorts allowed. Family-friendly swim trunks and bathing suits only.

Adults must watch their child(ren) at all times. An adult must always be present when their child is in the pool.

Any child who cannot stand or swim on their own without the support of a life jacket must always be within arm's reach of an adult.

Only United States Coast Guard approved & certified life jackets and inflatables are allowed in the pool.

Children over 9 years of age are not permitted in the small pool.

All children under 4 years of age, AND any child who has been potty trained for less than one full year, must wear 3 layers in the pool at all times: disposable swim diaper, snug-fitting reusable swim diaper, and bathing suit. **If the 3-layer policy is ignored and a pool closure occurs, you will be fined \$250 for the incurred costs as a result of a pool closure.**

Children must change clothes in a locker room, not on the pool deck.

Swim diapers must be disposed of in the locker rooms.

Kickboards and noodles are for swim lessons, Aqua fitness, or lap swimmers only. (Members are allowed to bring their own.) No standing or sitting on kickboards.

Swim lesson students are only allowed in the pool when their instructor is in the pool. If the instructor has not arrived, students must wait on the pool deck.

No glassware, squirt guns, or mono fins (mermaid fins) allowed.

Persons with open wounds, sores, infectious conditions (colds, flu, fever) will not be allowed in the pool.

Foul or abusive language will not be tolerated.

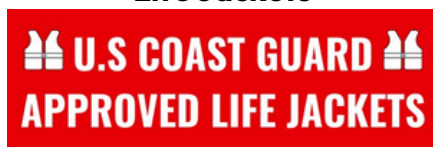
Unwanted touching of another adult or child is strictly prohibited. Respect personal space.

Lanes are designated for lap swimming only. Do not cut through or go over the lane lines. Lanes must be shared; If more than 2 people are using the lane, a circle pattern must be adopted.

Lifeguards always have final discretion regarding all pool activity.
