Minutes of 74th Annual Meeting, November 16th, 2014

Having established a quorum, the meeting was called to order by President James Stein at 4:30 PM on Sunday, November 16, 2014 at the Irwin A. and Robert D. Goodman Jewish Community Campus.

D'var Torah: Rabbi Avremel Matusof gave a D'var Torah.

Minutes of the 73rd Annual Meeting: Gary Friedman moved for their adoption. Lester Pines seconded the motion. The minutes of the 73rd Annual Meeting were approved as distributed.

Financial Report: The Financial Report of the Jewish Federation of Madison, covering the period ending February 28, 2014, was printed on pages 6 & 7 of the 2014 annual report. The report was audited by the public accounting firm of Reilly, Penner, & Benton, LLP. Gary Friedman entered a motion for its acceptance. Steven Morrison seconded it. The Financial Report was approved unanimously.

Executive Director's Report: Dina Weinbach reported on the past year for the Jewish Federation of Madison. The full report can be found in the Annual Report on pages 8 – 15.

Awards: The Jewish Federation of Madison has a history of recognizing outstanding volunteer contributions through several awards. It is the tradition of the Federation to have the previous award recipient announce the award winner for the current year. The list of all previous award recipients can be found in the annual report on pages 16 and 17.

Miriam Singer Sulman Young Leadership Award: Daniel Mitchell and Sasha Kerlow, the 2013 recipients of the award, presented the 2014 award to Zach Galin. Zach shared a few remarks after accepting the award. Congratulations to Zach for this well-deserved award.

Ben Minkoff Volunteer Service Award: Susan and Jonathan Lipp presented the award to Jordy Loeb even though he was unable to attend the Annual Meeting. Jordy was surprised at the October 21, 2014, Jewish Federation of Madison Board of Directors meeting with the award. The full speech and a video of the presentation were shared with those in attendance. The full speech can be read in the December 2014 edition of the *Madison Jewish News*. Congratulations to Jordy for this well-deserved award.

Andrea J. Stein Jewish Community Professional Award: The Andrea J. Stein Jewish Community Professional Award was established last year after Andrea, a beloved community and staff member, died suddenly and unexpectedly. It will be awarded annually to a Jewish community professional who promotes Jewish community outreach, engagement, and action that best serves k'lal Yisrael. It comes with a \$250 stipend to be used by the awardee for career development. The award will be made yearly by the Jewish Federation of Madison Executive Committee with input from the Jewish Federation of Madison staff and the Stein family. James Stein presented the first award to Mrs. Faygie Matusof. Faygie's remarks can be read in the December 2014 edition of the *Madison Jewish News*. Congratulations to Faygie.

Nominating Committee Report: Stefanie Kushner reported. The members of this year's nominating committee included Deborah Minkoff, Dan Mitchell, Beth Schreiber, Diane Seder, Marc Shovers, James Stein, James Youngerman and Stefanie Kushner. The report of the nominating committee can be found on p.19 of the 2014 annual report. Board members were asked to stand up to be recognized. New Board members were recognized and welcomed as well: Naomi Chesler, Shanee Ellison, Dan Esser, Ben Gold, Steve Lipton, Jordy Loeb, Linda Reivitz, Eric Schwartz, Aaron Seligman, Dan Weiss, and Orly Vardeny Ni. A motion to approve the slate was presented by Dan Mitchell, seconded by Jonathan Lipp, and unanimously approved. Special recognition was given to those board members who completed their terms of service. Thank you to Jacki Friend, Cynthia Hirsch, Lowell Lakritz, Mitchell Rapkin, Rachel Sauer, and Beth Schreiber. We look forward to their continued involvement. There was special recognition for Gary Friedman who has been a dedicated member of the Board of Directors of the Jewish Federation of Madison since 1988. Gary has been instrumental as chair of the Finance Committee and the Executive Committee since the 1990s, and invaluable when it came to reviewing the annual audit, setting up accounts for stock transfers, and overseeing all of the financial operations. Gary has been a steadfast, reliable, trusted board member for over 25 years. He listens carefully and comments when it matters most. He always has represented the voice of reason. His judgment is impeccable and the Jewish community owes him a great debt of gratitude. Everyone stood and applauded Gary for his distinguished service to the Jewish Federation of Madison.

A temporary recess of the annual meeting was taken and the newly-elected board of directors (page 19 of the 2014 Annual Report) was called into session. 2015 Annual Report The Year In Review

The Jewish Federation of Madison's mission guides us as we work toward building a strong and unified Jewish community which will ensure the survival, well-being and continuity of the Jewish people locally, in Israel, and throughout the world.

Our community strives to accomplish these goals through the many services and programs the Jewish Federation of Madison provides and supports.

SUPPORTING THOSE IN NEED

The 2014 **Tzedakah Campaign** closed at \$1,009,524.

The goal for the 2015 Tzedakah Campaign, led by Alicia Schiff and Marc Shovers, is \$1,018,000.



From its very inception in 1940 and to this day, we fulfill our strong commitment to the collective responsibility for Jews throughout the world through our support of the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, the Jewish Agency for Israel, World ORT, the Jewish Federations of North America, and several national Jewish organizations: Jewish Council for Public Affairs, Anti-Defamation League, HIAS, and the Jewish Labor Committee.

This past year our community helped resettle refugees from Syria in Jordan, Israel, Europe, and other places through the work of the Joint Distribution Committee and HIAS. Our community helped victims of the earthquake in Nepal and those affected by the fires in Houston through our work with the Joint Distribution Committee. When terrorist acts occurred in Israel, our community helped those in need through the Jewish Agency for Israel and the Fund for Victims of Terror.

Camp Shalom Scholarship Fund - \$104,000 was awarded to 180 campers who would otherwise be unable to attend camp. Camp Shalom has never denied a child a camp experience based on financial need. We are extremely proud of this accomplishment, and are thankful of the generous support of our scholarship donors.



A total of \$15,500 in full and partial scholarships was given to students in one or more of Gan HaYeled's programs. Not surprisingly, the financial needs of our community's preschool families continue to grow.

STRENGTHENING OUR COMMUNITY

The Jewish Federation of Madison worked with the Madison Metropolitan School District to adopt policy 4039 in regard to accommodations for religious holidays. The Jewish Federation continues to intervene when we hear of problems in the schools and work at finding solutions.

The Jewish Federation was one of the founding members of the Madison Metropolitan School District's Superintendent's Human Relations Advisory Council in the 1960's. We continue to be active in SHRAC and support its ongoing work to assure the success of all students in our public schools.

We monitor and respond to incidents of anti-Semitism in our community and are ever vigilant in protecting individual and civil rights and safety for Jews and indeed for all people.

Community Outreach efforts this past year included meeting with over 50 families who are new to Madison, who recently had a baby, or who want to learn more about the Jewish community. The primary charge of our Outreach Program is to connect and engage individuals and families with the many opportunities available to live Jewishly in the Madison area. Programs this past year included eighteen families in the Yad B'Yad (parent/caregiver/baby) group; Shabbat 75 with more than seventy-five households hosting Shabbat dinner; eighteen active players on the "Matzah Balls" sports team; 160 Challahgrams delivered to community members; three different trivia nights and a "Let's Paint" evening with twenty-eight participants.

The **Innovation Panel** distributed \$27,500 over the past year. In total, twenty innovative proposals from community groups and organizations have been funded over the past three years totaling \$71,930. The Innovation Panel strives to identify and invest in creative, innovative programs and organizations that have the potential for community impact in the Madison area. The goal is to inspire our community and challenge ourselves to be creative and forward thinking.

The Jewish Federation of Madison celebrated its **75th anniversary** this year with a gala attended by 215 people. Before dinner and dancing, the past presidents of the Federation were honored, and a video of the history of the organization with interviews of long-time community members was shared with the attendees. The Federation has a long rich history. Our predecessors established a wonderful foundation for us – now we will carry that legacy into the future.

Other programs through the Jewish Federation of Madison that engage and involve community members of different ages include **Future Directions**, a leadership development program where participants learn, engage, and decide their path for future involvement in the Jewish community; **Yom Ha'Atzmaut**, an opportunity for the local community to celebrate Israel's Birthday; **Yom Hashoah**, a community wide program to commemorate the Holocaust; annual **Teachers' Convention** open to all Jewish educators; the **Hava Nagila Jewish Community Picnic**, an annual event to gather people in the community to kick-off the summer and experience the vibrancy of Jewish life in the area.

Madison Jewish News, the Federation's monthly newspaper, in its 48th year, continues to fulfill its commitment to excellence as a vehicle for reaching our growing Jewish community, emphasizing local Jewish news and information in a colorful and contemporary newspaper format.

The Jewish Federation of Madison continues its online presence with our website, **JewishMadison.org**, Twitter, Instagram and Facebook. More than 1,400 community members also subscribe to our weekly Monday Morning e-newsletter to receive timely and important information and announcements.

The Jewish Federation of Madison continues to fund and support **Jewish Social Services, UW Hillel, the Wisconsin Jewish Conference, Chabad at the University of Wisconsin,** and the **Madison Jewish Community Day School.**

ENHANCING OUR FACILITIES

Many repairs and enhancements were completed at the **Irwin A. and Robert D. Goodman Jewish Community Campus,** thanks to a grant from the Irwin A. and Robert D. Goodman Foundation. The Goodman Foundation has our profound thanks for their continuous and generous support of the Federation's programs and facilities.

The Goodman Campus Committee, expertly chaired by Joel Minkoff, created an updated Master Plan and proposal for the future of the campus.

The Max Weinstein Building Headquarters Committee, expertly co-chaired by Eric Schwartz and Joe Shumow, completed a proposal for the future of the building. This includes extra office space, additional and expanded meeting space, additional parking, adequate indoor and outdoor activity and recreation space and additional classrooms for the preschool.

ENGAGING OUR CHILDREN

Camp Shalom, for campers entering kindergarten through grade five, completed its 61st summer, the fifteenth at the Irwin A. and Robert D. Goodman Jewish Community Campus. We served a total of 733 campers this summer.

Camp Shalom Noar Bogrim, completed its third summer. This program, for sixth through ninth grade children, served 221 campers. The ninth grade program itself served 48 campers.

The success of Camp Shalom is due to many factors, the staff being the most important. We were privileged to have 105 staff serving our two day camps this past summer.

One Happy Camper - In partnership with the Foundation for Jewish Camping, the Federation made available up to \$1,000 per camper and helped send twenty children to Jewish resident camps for the first time.

The **Hilde L. Mosse Gan HaYeled Preschool** offers programs for newborns through age five with year-round, all-day offerings. We have fourteen children enrolled in our Dalet program (4-and 5-year-olds), ten in Gimel (3-year-olds), eleven

in the Bet (2-year-olds) program, and we also offer a Schmooze and Tunes music program for children three years and younger. We served twenty-six children in Camp Shalom Katan, our summer program. Gan HaYeled, now in its 45th year, continues to offer excellence in curriculum, programming, and Jewish learning.

Midrasha Hebrew High School, the joint post-B'nai Mitzvah program of the Jewish Federation, Beth Israel Center, and Temple Beth El, began its 40th year with sixty-five students enrolled. Sixteen are newly-entering eighth grade students. Twenty-seven students are studying Hebrew. The eleventh and twelfth grades have twenty-six students enrolled; ten of them seniors. Since its inception, the Jewish Federation has provided incentive scholarships to graduating seniors. For the fifth year in a row, the Laurence A. Weinstein Midrasha Incentive Award of up to \$2,000 was awarded to graduating seniors - fifteen last May - for continuing Jewish education in college or educational trips to Israel taken within the first two years after High School graduation.

Yonim, Madison's outstanding Israeli folk dance program is open to all students from kindergarten through 12th grade. Thirty-three students take part in Yonim.

Family Education Programs included Hanukkah Tzedakah Night, Women's Night Out and Jewelry Making, Hamantashen Baking Workshop, Havdalah Party, and summer pool parties.

CONNECTING WITH ISRAEL

Partnership Together (P2G) is a program of the Jewish Agency of Israel and has become a paradigm of success, partnering 550 global Jewish communities directly with 45 Israeli communities, the majority of which are in national priority areas. Communities share ideas, strengths, challenges and models of success, empowering one another to generate waves of change. And the impact of these projects goes far deeper than the community level - each of us has the opportunity to become directly and personally involved. Madison has joined Milwaukee, Tulsa and St. Paul in partnering with the Sovev Kinneret region in Israel. P2G programming this past year included a visit from the Israeli Medical Clowns, a Sovev Kinneret photograph exhibit curated by Guy Shoshany, hosting an Israeli marathon group, visiting artists, and more.

Community Shlichim - In August, we began the thirteenth year of participating in the Shlichut program offered by JAFI (Jewish Agency for Israel). We said "L'hitraot" (until we see you again) to Mickey, Racheli and Ofek Komar Aziz after their second year ended and welcomed our new Shlichim, Daniel Gil and Shirly Raiz-Gil.

The Shlichim work hard to develop, organize, and facilitate Israel educational programs for all parts of the Jewish community. They offer resources related to travel to Israel and promoting aliyah; they enhance the development and commitment of lay leadership; and they reinforce the community's enduring connection to Israel and the Israeli people.
