

HOW TO APPLY FOR A VISITOR VISA & OPEN WORK PERMIT TO CANADA FROM UKRAINE UNDER THE CANADA-UKRAINE AUTHORIZATION FOR EMERGENCY TRAVEL?

Below is a Summary of Procedures on how to Apply for a Visitor Visa and Open Work Permit to Travel to Canada under the Canada-Ukraine Authorization for Emergency Travel (CUAET) for individuals who are currently outside of Canada.¹ If the individual is currently inside Canada, then the application requirements are different. For general information to apply from within Canada, please see this website: <https://www.canada.ca/en/immigration-refugees-citizenship/services/immigrate-canada/ukraine-measures/cuaet.html>.

NOTE: On March 17, 2022, the Government of Canada announced special measures to assist Ukrainian citizens and their immediate family members to come into Canada on a temporary basis to work, to study or to stay in Canada for up to three (3) years. Immediate family members are defined as: (i) the spouse or common law partner of an Ukrainian national; (ii) their dependent child; (iii) the dependent child of their spouse or common law partner; and (iv) a dependent child of their dependent child.

In order to travel to Canada, a citizen of Ukraine or their immediate family members need to either (1) have a valid Visitor Visa, or (2) apply for a Visitor Visa on the IRCC Portal (<https://portal-portail.apps.cic.gc.ca/signin?lang=en>).

Please note that applying for a Visitor Visa and Open Work Permit do not guarantee that the application will be approved. This is because an Immigration Officer will make a final decision based on the application.

1) SUMMARY

This guide provides instructions on the steps required to apply for a Visitor Visa and Open Work Permit under CUAET. The Government of Canada is currently aiming to process the application within 14 days of receipt of a complete application, for standard, non-complex cases.

Step One:

- Apply for a Visitor Visa and Open Work Permit online via the IRCC Portal and submit your application (<https://portal-portail.apps.cic.gc.ca/signin?lang=en>)

Step Two:

- The Government of Canada will request the Applicant to provide biometrics (fingerprint and photo) at a Visa Application Centre if the Applicant does not already have valid biometrics on file.
- Currently, the Visa Application Centres in Ukraine are closed. Given this, in order to finalize the Visitor Visa application the Applicant will either need to (1) submit a request for exemption of the biometric requirement required to be submitted in the Visitor Visa application by uploading a request letter (attached at Appendix “A” hereto is a form of this request letter that

can be used), or (2) travel to a Visa Application Centre from outside of Ukraine to complete the biometrics requirement.

Step Three:

- Lastly, before the Visitor Visa and Open Work Permit applications are approved, the Applicant will need to mail their passport to a Visa Application Centre in Ukraine. This step will be difficult to complete because all of the Visa Application Centres in Ukraine are currently closed. Given this, the Applicant may need to mail the passport to a Visa Application Centre from outside Ukraine and the Applicant would need to travel to that location in order to pick up the passport with the Visitor Visa.

NOTE: If the Applicant does not have a valid passport, it is still worth submitting an application as the Government of Canada has announced that they may issue a single journey travel document and a temporary resident permit overseas to permit travel for those without a valid passport. This is done on a case-by-case basis, under exceptional circumstances.

2) OTHER TRAVEL CONSIDERATIONS RELATED TO COVID-19

Further, in order for a citizen of Ukraine and their immediate family members to be allowed to board an airplane to travel to Canada, they must normally meet the below two Covid-19 requirements:

1. **Proof of Vaccination:** Adults 18 years of age or older must be fully vaccinated. This means you have received two doses of a World Health Organization approved Covid-19 vaccine and the second dose was received more than 14 days before your travel to Canada. Those who are under 18 years of age do not need to be fully vaccinated. The Government of Canada has announced that citizens of Ukraine and their immediate family members will be exempt from Canada's COVID-19 vaccination entry requirements, but must meet all other public health requirements for travel, such as use of ArriveCAN app, quarantine for 14 days, and COVID-19 testing on arrival and day 8.
2. **Pre-Arrival COVID-19 Test:** Anyone over the age of 5 must obtain an authorized clinic administered rapid antigen test taken within 24 hours from departure to Canada or proof of positive molecular test taken at least 10 days before and within 180 days of departure to Canada. On April 1, 2022, the Government of Canada will remove the pre-arrival COVID-19 test requirement for travellers who are fully vaccinated. For travellers who are not fully vaccinated the pre-arrival COVID-19 test requirement will continue to apply to them.

3) VISITOR VISA AND OPEN WORK PERMIT APPLICATION

Below are the steps to apply for a Visitor Visa and Open Work Permit on the IRCC Portal. You will need to have access to a computer with internet access.

1. **Website:** The website to apply for a Visitor Visa and Open Work Permit is as follows:

2. **Terms and Conditions:** After you have signed into the IRCC Portal, you will need to accept the terms and conditions by clicking “**I accept**” before you can fill in the Visitor Visa application.

 - You have **60 days** (from when you start your application) to submit a complete application.
 - After 60 days, the system deletes your information.

NOTE: Applying for an open work permit will not delay your application. **It is highly recommended that you apply for a visitor visa and open work permit together.** If you do not apply for an open work permit at the same time, then when you apply for an open work permit while you are in Canada the current processing time is up to 4.5 months and you will not be able to work in Canada until your work permit application is approved.

(j) Question: Have you held a Canadian Visitor Visa in the past 10 years?

Answer: Answer yes or no to having held a Canadian Visitor Visa in the last ten years.

(k) Question: Do you currently hold a valid US non-immigrant visa (i.e. Visitor Visa)?

Answer: Answer yes or no to having held a valid US non-immigrant visa.

(l) Question: Are you travelling to Canada by air?

Answer: Yes

Once you have answered all of the above questions, you will click “**Save and Continue**”.

You will need to list your current country of residence, Ukraine. Further, if you have lived in another country for more than 6 months in the past five years, then you will include this information.

Please note if you have not completed biometrics, then you will normally need to pay the fee for biometrics (CAD \$85.00 per person) and complete biometrics once you receive a biometrics request letter. The fee for the biometrics will be exempt under CUAET.

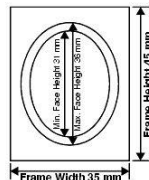

The above diagram tells you what documents you need to attach to your Visitor Visa and Open Work Permit applications. **If the documents are not in English or French, then it must be translated by a certified translator in Ukraine.** Some of the documents include (not an exhaustive list):

- A copy of your national identity document.
- A copy of your passport photo page and all marked pages.
- Proof of funds (e.g. copy of bank statements and letter of support from family/friends in Canada, if applicable).
- A letter to request for exemption from the biometrics requirement due to the Visa Application Centres in Ukraine are currently closed because of the war between Russia and Ukraine, if applicable.
- A copy of your photo per the below specifications

Photograph and head size specifications



- The frame size must be at least 35 mm x 45 mm (1 3/8" x 1 3/4").
- The photographs must show the full front view of the head, with the face in the middle of the photograph, and include the top of the shoulders.
- The size of the head, from chin to crown, must be between 31 mm (1 1/4") and 36 mm (1 7/16").
- Crown means the top of the head or (if obscured by hair or a head covering) where the top of the head or skull would be if it could be seen.
- If the photographs do not meet the specifications, you will have to provide new photographs before your application can be processed.

30. Consent and Declaration

You need to carefully read the consent and declaration section as you are declaring you have answered all questions in the Visitor Visa and Open Work Permit applications fully and truthfully. If you have not answered all questions in the Visitor Visa and Open Work Permit applications fully and truthfully, then you may not be allowed to travel to Canada for 5 years.

Consent and declaration

Citizenship and Immigration Canada (CIC), or an organization at CIC's request, may want to contact you in the future to ask you about any services you received from CIC prior to the application process (such as participation in an information forum), during the application process (including the application process itself as well as orientation or accreditation services), and services received after arriving in Canada (including settlement, integration and citizenship). CIC will use this information, along with the information provided by other individuals, for research, performance measurement or evaluation purposes. CIC will not use this information to make any decisions about you personally.

32. Confirmation of Submission

Once the Visitor Visa and Open Work Permit applications are submitted online, the Applicant will get the below message.

Within 24 hours, you should get a confirmation message in your account for each application you submitted. You'll also receive a PDF copy of the information you submitted in a separate message. Download a copy for your records.

33. Monitoring the Visitor Visa and Open Work Permit Applications

The Government of Canada will contact the Applicant by email when there is an update on the status of the Visitor Visa and Open Work Permit applications. If the Government of Canada needs additional information from the Applicant, then the Government of Canada will email the Applicant and the Applicant will need to log into the IRCC Portal account to read the message.
