Dear Chaverim (Friends),

As we reflect on the past fiscal year, our Jewish Toledo community navigated through another unprecedented year of success, tragedy, and resilience. This annual report highlights a small portion of our collective journey to build a resilient and vibrant present and future for Jewish Toledo.

We should not forget that, before the horrors of October 7, we were living our Jewish lives fully. Our community enjoyed multiple Purim celebrations; Jewish Federation and Foundation of Greater Toledo helped to send nearly 40 children to Jewish overnight summer camp; we watched Jewish films, welcomed Israeli shinshinim (emissaries) to interact with our young people, took care of and programmed for our seniors, and were planning our first mission to Israel in more than 15 years for over 20 travelers. Sadly, our joy turned to immense sadness and distress with the unprecedented terror from Gaza. Resilient and ready to respond to any challenge, within days after the attack, we held our first community event and within a month, Jewish Toledo raised over \$1.1M for the Israel Relief Fund. Unfortunately, the war led us to postpone our November Israel mission.

Our remarkable response to the events of October 7 underscores the deep compassion and generosity within our community. Our fundraising has been instrumental in providing critical aid to help rebuilding efforts and fostering hope in Israel during a time of immense need.

The war has not only caused turmoil in Israel, but it has also ignited a fire of rising antisemitism globally and locally that is deeply concerning. We have confronted this issue with vigilance and proactivity, advocating against hatred and discrimination wherever it may arise. JFGT remains steadfast in promoting education, awareness, and community engagement to combat antisemitism and to ensure the safety and dignity of every Jew.

Despite these challenges, our commitment to delivering a Jewish future for our community has never wavered. Through innovative programs, educational initiatives, and cultural celebrations, we continue to enrich Jewish life, inspire future generations, and strengthen our bonds of unity and belonging.

Looking ahead, we remain optimistic about the opportunities to further our impact, deepen our connections, and build a thriving Jewish community together. Your support, dedication, and partnership are invaluable as we work to deliver a bright Jewish future.

Thank you for your unwavering commitment to Jewish Federation and Foundation of Greater Toledo. Together, we will continue to write the next chapters of our community's story with hope, resilience, and a profound sense of unity.

# Education and Engagement



JFGT strives to create a path to cultivate and strengthen Jewish identity and is committed to helping all individuals access Jewish learning and identity-building experiences. At camp, love for Jewish life grows, friendships are formed, community is created, and Jewish identity is both forged and reinforced by a sense of belonging.

- **\$66,000+** from the long-term community needs fund and **\$7,250** from the Jewish Experience Fund sent **39** Jewish Toledo campers to Jewish overnight camp in 2023, including 7 first-time campers
- **37** Jewish children attended Camp Inspiration and stuffed **200+** kindness kits for men, women, and children in need. Camp Inspiration is funded by the Inspiration Fund and organized in partnership with Temple Shomer Emunim

## Gan Yeladim Preschool

- **Funded entirely** with tuition from parents and support from JFGT's annual campaign and TJCF Funds
- **Mountains** of Stars of David in every size and color, intricately crafted from a variety of materials by the children at Gan Yeladim
- **Heaps** of tzedakah coins generously given to support our local Toledo community and assist our broader family in Israel
- **Countless** Hebrew words and songs mastered this year
- **An overflow** of heartfelt well-wishing cards for birthdays, get well soon, and moments of sadness, tenderly created by the preschool children
- **Stacks** of Mitzvah notes lovingly placed on our preschool's big Kotel wall
- **Numerous** little wrists proudly displaying Israel bracelets

# Support and Assistance



Jewish Senior, Family & Social Services (JSFSS) provides caring, professional services to greater Toledo and is committed to excellent outreach and advocacy for the vulnerable members of the Jewish community including those facing economic or social challenges. Guided by the Jewish values of *tikkun olam* (repairing the world) and *gemilut chasidim* (acts of loving kindness), JSFSS provides essential programs and services that enhance and strengthen the lives of children, adults, families, and seniors.

- **1,731** total individuals received food, goods, and other pantry services through **672** appointments
- **\$11,910+** received in 2023 from the Meijer Simply Give Campaign
- **\$2,258** received from S&G Convenience Stores as a community partner recipient
- **830** individuals received assessment, support, care management, or other vital services through JSFSS
- **5** Create & Relate events welcomed **100+** adults interested in taking care of their mental health and well-being. The annual senior expo provided information on local services and available support
- **613** home and facility visits by JSFSS staff
- **183** rides given to doctor appointments, physical therapy, congregational services, community programs, and more
- **203+** meals delivered as part of the Emergent Nutritional Subsidies to senior clients in need of short-term nutritional assistance
- **\$90,000** in grants received through the Ohio Department of Aging At-Home Technology pilot program to help explore, develop, and use technology-based programs and services to help **110** Jewish seniors live independently longer



# Local & Global Resilience



Jewish Community Relations Council (JCRC) represents the Greater Toledo Jewish community, Israel, and Jews to the general community; establishes collaborative relationships with other ethnic, racial, civic, and religious groups; promotes interests through government relations at the Federal, State, and local levels and with the media; and educates and advocates on important issues, seeking consensus with a commitment to Jewish values.

- **Hosted Governor Mike DeWine** for a meeting with Jewish community leaders and welcomed our Western Galilee Partnership2Gether family for a Yom HaZikaron (National Day of Remembrance in Israel) community commemoration event
- **Inspired the future of Jewish Toledo** at the religious schools and Jewish youth groups by connecting them with young Israelis, including visits with 2 Israeli Shinshinim (emissaries)
- **150+** non-Jewish community members welcomed to a model Passover seder
- **100+** educated at Shine a Light on Antisemitism about rising Jew-hatred and local law enforcement about lessons learned from the Holocaust
- Collaborated with **16** partnering organizations that sponsored Shine a Light on Hate: Creating a Compassionate Community
- Ruth Fajerman Markowicz Holocaust Resource Center and its Director, Hindea Markowicz, presented the annual Diversity Day program at the Valentine Theatre where **800+** high school students attended an educational Holocaust program
- **Informed local journalists** through an Israel media briefing and community rally for Israel and advocated for our Jewish community to elected officials with the help of Ohio Jewish Communities
- **Discussed antisemitism, Israeli history, and Jewish views** on important contemporary issues at the JCRC fall film festival, heard from two local Holocaust survivors, and empowered our community's second generation survivors to share their families' stories



# Israel Relief Fund

## *Am Yisrael Chai*

This war was unlike any before. And so were the needs...

The true spirit of our Jewish community emerged as we came together to deliver over **\$1,100,000** to support our brothers and sisters in need in Israel.

- **\$34,000** to Leket Israel for hot meals, formula, diapers, food packages, and basic supplies to evacuees
- **\$11,000** for Partnership2Gether Western Galilee's security equipment in Matte Asher
- **\$11,000** toward computers for remote learning and portable bomb shelters in Akko and Matte Asher
- **\$11,000** to the Western Galilee Medical Center for urgent medical equipment and supplies
- **\$33,000** for Dror Israel to assist with childcare for evacuees
- **\$7,500** for Krembo Wings Akko to support children and youth living with special needs
- **\$900,000+** to Jewish Federations of North America's general Israel Relief Fund that raised nearly **\$850 million**

# Safety and Security



- **101+** hours of off-duty police support for **24** JFGT events in 2023 plus **countless** other hours in support of local congregational services, events, trainings, and security updates
- **\$65,000** awarded through the State of Ohio Security Grants to replace the fencing at Beth Shalom Cemetery
- **4+** new security upgrades at Beth Shalom Cemetery including new security grade doors and windows for the chapel and new security light poles on the property
- **Real-time** consideration and monitored threats specifically targeting Ohio Jewish communities by **Ohio Regional Intelligence Center (ORIC)**
- **Monthly** safety and security tips, countless updates, alerts, and training by Community Security Director Dave Tullis that kept our community safe



# The 2023 Annual Campaign Raised \$1,106,305 from 725 Donors

- **90%** of donations supported local community needs, including:
  - **Safety and security** for our JFGT campus and local Jewish institutions; Jewish Community Relations Council; Jewish Senior, Family and Social Services Family Food Pantry; Friendship Circle (in part); *Toledo Jewish News*; Jewish senior programs; Gan Yeladim Preschool; B'nai B'rith Youth Organization (BBYO); Young Leadership; Hillel419; Next Jewish Generation, Toledo Jewish Community Cemetery Association; and community programs
- **10%** of donations supported charities in Israel and other overseas allocations, including:
  - **ORT's YOUiversity** program in Matte Asher, which provides STEAM education after school; Youth Futures in Akko's mentorship programs for kids in need; JDC-Israel to support a Haredi workforce and mental health programs; and Dror Israel's Akko Educators Kibbutz program for immigrants from the former Soviet Union
- **332** Women's Philanthropy Donors
  - **7** Lion of Judah Endowments, gifts in perpetuity currently providing a lasting legacy
  - **51** Lion of Judah Donors, women who give **\$5,000+** each year
  - **55** Pomegranates, women who give **\$1,800 - \$4,999** each year
  - **219** Pearls, women who give **\$180 - \$1,799** each year

# Making an Impact through Legacy Giving

## Wasserstrom Supporting Organization becomes Wasserstrom Hillel Fund

Philip Wasserstrom (z"l) established the Philip Wasserstrom Supporting Organization (SO) in 1996 to support the purposes and mission of Jewish Federation of Greater Toledo (JFGT). He expressed a deep sense of gratitude for the community and saw this SO as his opportunity to give back. Phil believed that grants from the SO could enable projects that might otherwise be unattainable.

Since its inception, the Wasserstrom SO has provided substantial funding for a variety of community programs and initiatives, including:

- Community Bar/Bat Mitzvah party;
- United Jewish Council\* Israel mission;
- Yom Ha'Atzmaut programs;
- UJC's Annual Campaign;
- Chabad – Friendship Circle;
- Congregation B'nai Israel Capital Campaign;
- Toledo Board of Jewish Education scholarship assistance;
- Leadership development;
- University of Toledo (UT) / Bowling Green State University (BGSU) Hillel;
- College scholarships;
- Jewish programming for children and youth, including Hanukkah Palooza; and
- Jewish art, book, music, and film festivals.

Throughout his lifetime, Phil demonstrated a particular commitment to Hillel, contributing significantly to both its operations and capital needs. In alignment with his wishes, in 2023, the SO Board of Trustees concluded that the SO had fulfilled its original mission and decided that the SO's philanthropic goals would be best served by distributing its assets to create the Philip Wasserstrom Hillel Fund.

Sam Zyndorf, SO trustee, said, "Phil was originally from Pennsylvania, and he made his life in Toledo. It was always important for him to give back to his town, and the best way to do this was to give back to children and young people. He would be overjoyed to see where his contributions are making a difference today."

"Phil was a tough businessman with a soft spot for Jewish Toledo," Joel Beren, SO trustee, added, "He wanted to make a difference in the lives of young members of our community. When the University of Toledo approached the Federation nearly 15 years ago, the Wasserstrom Family Supporting Organization stepped up and made the lead gift to get the program off the ground. The UT Hillel House bears the name of the Wasserstrom family in honor of that generosity.

"Over the years, the trustees of the supporting organization focused more and more of the annual allocations to Hillel. After much discussion, the trustees (Joel Beren, Sam Zyndorf, Harley Kripke, Jerry Phillips, and Adele Wasserstrom) voted to sunset the SO and create a designated fund within the Toledo Jewish Community Foundation specifically for the benefit of Hillel419 (UT and BGSU)."

The newly established Philip Wasserstrom Hillel Fund is dedicated to permanently supporting the charitable, educational, and religious purposes of JFGT, with a focus on the operational and capital expenses incurred in connection with Hillel programming at UT and BGSU.

## **Gordon Levine (1934-2024)**

Gordon I. Levine (z"l) passed away on May 26, 2024. He was born March 3, 1934, in Toledo, Ohio, to Ann and Abe Levine.

Gordon and his best friend and brother, Joel, took a small steel service center named Wabash-Lagrange Steel, and together built it into a nationally recognized specialist in structural steel, supplying countless projects throughout the United States. They were most proud of the hundreds of families that they helped support by creating a successful enterprise.

Gordon's father Abe, and Abe's father, Sam, believed it a responsibility to support those in need. Sam would say, if you have two nickels to rub together, you should give one away. Gordon lived by this philosophy and was committed to making the world a better place.

He held significant roles in the Jewish and general communities, including as President of the Toledo Jewish Community Center, Vice President of Temple Shomer Emunim, Chair of the Toledo Jewish Community Foundation, President of Glengarry Country Club, and member of the Board of First National Bank and its successor Fifth Third Bank board.

## **Don Solomon (1932-2024)**



Don Solomon (z"l) passed away on February 13, 2024. He was born November 29, 1932 to Ben and Mary Solomon.

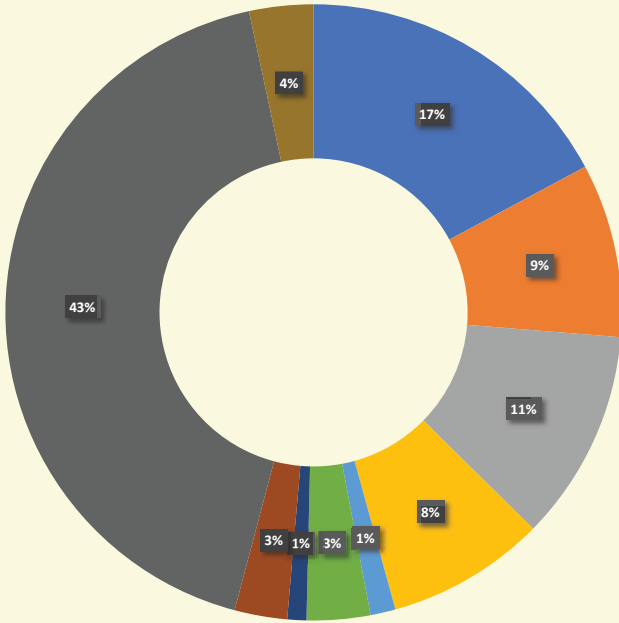
After graduating from Harvard University at a time when Harvard had a quota limiting the number of Jewish students, Don returned to Toledo to help his father run Ben's Truck Parts. In 1999, he created the Donald Solomon Supporting Organization with the Toledo Jewish Community Foundation (TJCF), serving as Foundation chair from 2002-2010.

In his own words, Don established three pillars of his philanthropy: primary education (secular and Jewish) in northwest Ohio and Israel, Jewish life in Toledo, and domestic and overseas college-aged students. He provided generous scholarships to advance the liberal arts at The University of Toledo, Bowling Green, the Toledo School for the Arts, Jewish Federation of Greater Toledo, Harvard University, and Shalem College in Jerusalem. In honor

of his parents, Don established the Ben and Mary Solomon Scholarship fund.

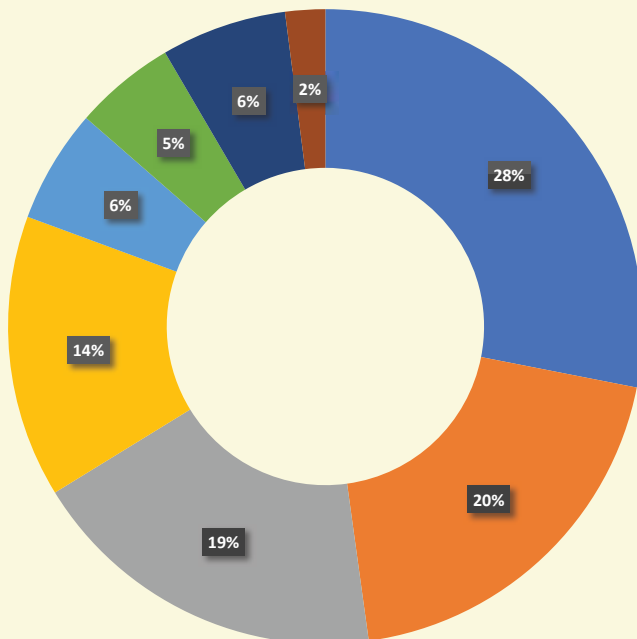

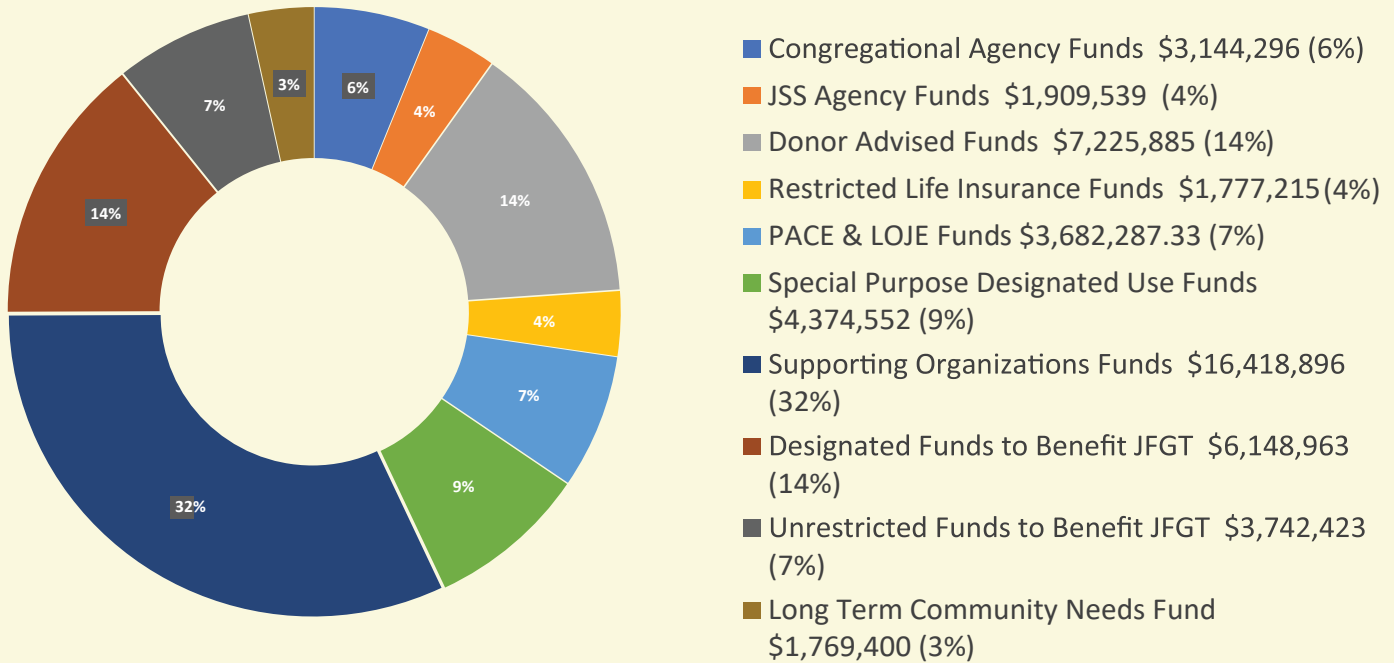

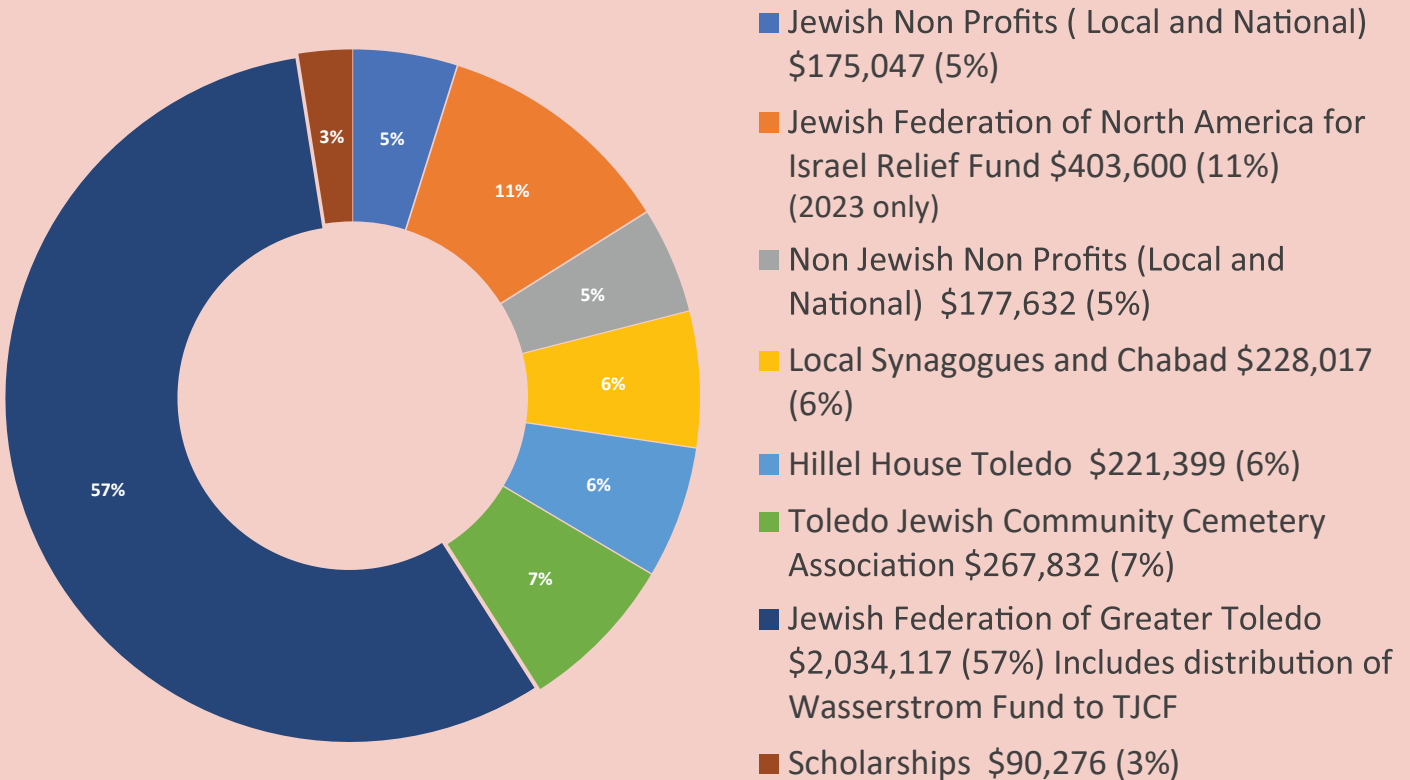

### Lourdes University

Lourdes University is a dedicated partner with Jewish Federation of Greater Toledo, helping JFGT promote education, diversity, and inclusion through programming such as the Jewish Community Relations Council (JCRC) **Interfaith Seder** in April 2024, **Shine a Light on Hate: Creating a Compassionate Community** in August 2023, the **JCRC Fall into Film Series August-December 2023**, and more.

- JCRC in partnership with Lourdes University's Lifelong Learning Program, hosted the **Interfaith model Passover seder** specifically geared toward our non-Jewish neighbors and open to all. This annual event is meant to show how a seder is traditionally held, debunking myths and stereotypes while helping to teach others about the important Jewish holiday.

- **Shine a Light on Hate: Creating a Compassionate Community** was designed as a response to the significant recent increase in violence, harassment, and intimidation against a variety of groups. The event considered factors that lead to discrimination and intolerance, and then offered constructive actions that can be taken within one's own area of influence to build a more inclusive and welcoming society.

- From Lake Erie to the Red Sea, the **JCRC Fall into Films Series** presented thought-provoking and entertaining stories and documentaries that included post-film discussions with authors, producers, and experts in each film's subject matter.

## Young Volunteer Awards

Established in 1999, the High School Leadership Award recognizes exceptional high school students from each local synagogue, the local BBYO chapter, and Friendship Circle.
